(Elaine Thompson/AP) Doing the right thing has never been more important. That's one of the messages Seattle City Councilman Tim Burgess is sending with his "Keep Seattle Green" campaign. "I believe it's time to reduce, reduce, and recycle," he told the members of the Eastlake Neighborhood Association gathered for an outdoor community meeting at the Eastlake Community Center. "I want to know that what goes in the blue bin, goes in the blue bin." Two neighbors welcomed him: David Green, who is a longtime Seattle activist and a founder of the Eastlake Greenbelt, and Elise Baughman, a seasoned environmental activist who helped create the city's grunge cleanup site years ago. But the main focus of the hourlong talk was the councilmember's proposed Greenhouse Act, which would require greenhouses be kept on private property, be built with local materials, and allow people to grow vegetables and harvest some of their own food. "Local food is the way to go," he said. "I don't want people to have to import food; if they're going to have to, let us eat what we grow." If the act becomes law in Seattle, it would apply to commercial greenhouses and to the dozens of glass houses of the kind that have proliferated in South Lake Union and other places in the city. Greenhouses are already covered by another state law that requires recyclable materials be used in the construction. So, according to Burgess, the act focuses on owners of private property who want to grow their own food, usually gardeners or farmers. Burgess, a former business owner who is running for
